This form must be signed and by submitting your details you agree to participate in this scheme.

Complete this form as soon as possible. All bans (ie. Total Fire Bans, Harvest & Vehicle Movement Bans, etc.) will continue to be announced on ABC radio at 10am and 2pm. However, please note ABC Radio does not advise when bans are lifted. ABC Radio is still the primary means of notifying farmers of bans. Text messages should not be relied on, as the SMS System is not a guaranteed service from telecommunication companies.
